Requirements

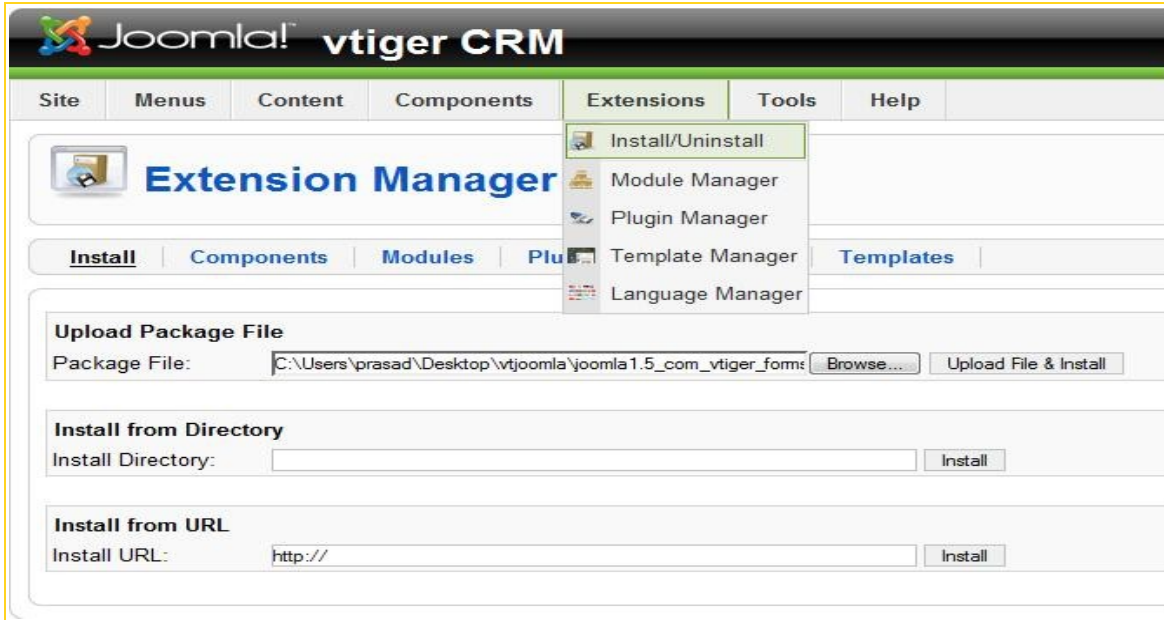
- [Joomla](#) should be installed (version 1.5.0 or above)
- vtiger CRM 5.1.0 should be installed (with Webforms optional module)
- PHP Curl extension should be enabled.

Installation

- Visit <http://forge.vtiger.com/projects/vtjoomla>
- Download *joomla1.5_com_vtiger_forms-x.y.zip* [*Joomla component*]
- Download *joomla1.5_mod_vtiger_forms-x.y.zip* [*Joomla Module*]
- Login as Joomla administrator for further installation.

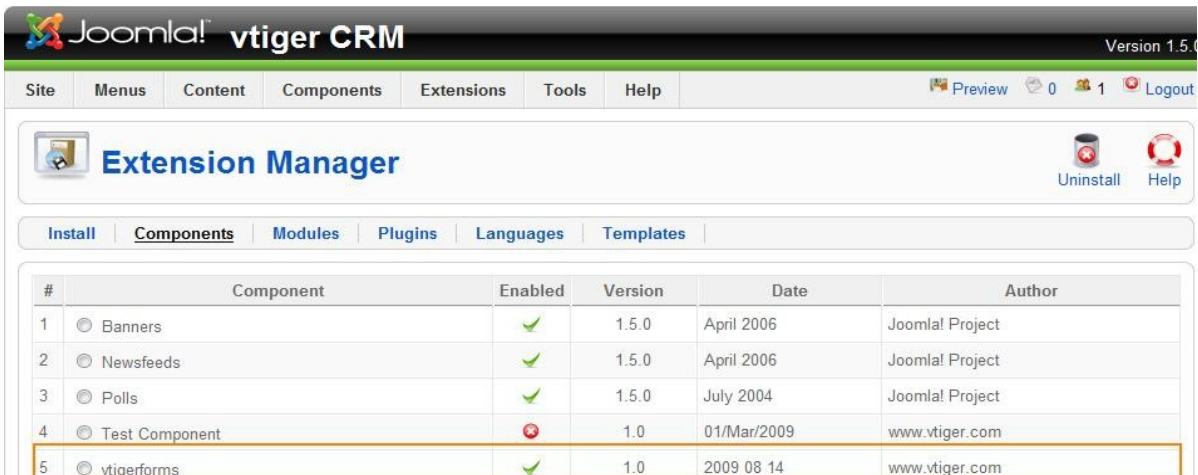
